Mole National Park

A bit of that which they don't find at home. That is the reason most travellers come to Africa. Although widely-known for its stirring history of empires and ancient Ashanti kingdoms, Ghana offers the best game-viewing in West Africa and amongst the finest quality elephant experience on the continent. The place is Mole National Park, two hours' drive west of the north-eastern city of Tamale. The camp is positioned on a hill with views over woodlands and waterhole that will have travellers taking deep, full breaths. Yet most striking is the peaceful co-existence between animal and human. In the staff village, among the houses, elephants tug on grass, warthogs dig for roots and baboons search out ticks while people go about their daily business. An utterly sublime experience.
